The U.S. Army Space and Missile Defense Command and the U.S. Department of the Navy (Navy) have prepared a Draft Document of Environmental Protection (DEP) to provide a description of proposed missile flight test activities at Kwajalein Atoll, the associated potential environmental effects, and procedures for monitoring, notification, and reporting. Testing would involve flight tests from sea-based launch locations, vehicle flight over the ocean, splashdown of boosters in the open ocean, and payload impact either in broad ocean areas or at U.S. Army test sites at Kwajalein Atoll in the Republic of the Marshall Islands. Within the Republic of the Marshall Islands, the activity would be located at the Ronald Reagan Ballistic Missile Defense Test Site (RTS) within the United States Army Kwajalein Atoll (USAKA). Flight test payloads would impact at target sites within the deepwater Kwajalein Missile Impact Scoring System (KMISS) range and on land at Illeginni Islet. Flight test support activities such as vessel traffic and human activity would occur at RTS as well as within travel routes between test sites and Kwajalein Harbor at Kwajalein Islet.

## INFORMATION SPARTAN SUPPORTS FISHERIES PATROL IN MARSHALL ISLANDS

#### HOURGLASS REPORT

An Air Force C-27J Spartan and its crew have played a key role in the Pacific Islands Forum Fisheries Agency's first maritime surveillance operation of 2025, Operation Rai Balang, conducted under the broader Operation Solania framework.

Operating out of Bucholz Army Airfield, a United States Army airfield located on Kwajalein Atoll in the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI), the ADF team worked alongside regional partners to patrol and protect Pacific fisheries, helping to detect and deter illegal fishing activity.

Detachment Commander Squadron Leader Nicholas Pound said supporting the operation was not only important for regional security, but also for the livelihoods of Marshallese communities who rely on healthy and sustainable fisheries.

"Illegal fishing directly impacts the food security and economic wellbeing of Pacific nations like the RMI," Squadron Leader Pound said.

"Being part of Operation Rai Balang is about working together with our Pacific partners to safeguard these critical resources, ensuring future generations can continue to benefit from them."

The Spartan's ability to operate from Kwajalein Atoll provided a strategic advantage, allowing the crew to cover vast areas of ocean quickly and effectively.

Squadron Leader Pound highlighted the significance of being able to launch from Bucholz Army Airfield. "The support from our American colleagues at the US Army Garrison-Kwajalein Atoll has been outstanding," he said.

"They opened their base to us without hesitation, providing everything we needed to operate successfully. It's a great example of international engagement working on multiple levels – between Australia, the Marshall Islands, the US, and the broader Pacific community."

The deployment demonstrated the flexibility of the C-27J Spartan, an aircraft well suited for operations in remote locations and small airstrips across the Pacific.

Squadron Leader Pound said the operation highlighted how close collaboration between nations strengthened regional resilience.

"Partnerships like this highlight how Australia, the US, and our Pacific neighbours can come together to support a secure, stable and prosperous region," he said.

"We're grateful to the US Army for being such welcoming hosts, and proud to have contributed to an operation that delivers real outcomes for the people of the Marshall Islands and the Pacific."

Colonel Andrew Morgan, Commander US Army Kwajalein Atoll and US Army Garrison – Kwajalein Atoll, said the mission demonstrated the strength of shared partnerships in the Pacific.

"We were proud to host our Australian friends at Bucholz Army Airfield," Colonel Morgan said.

"Supporting operations like these shows how, together, we can achieve common goals for the security and prosperity of the region. It was a privilege to provide the ADF a base to operate from while helping our Marshallese partners."

Operation Rai Balang is one of several maritime surveillance operations coordi-



nated by the Forum Fisheries Agency each year, bringing together defence and law enforcement agencies to com-

bat illegal fishing across the Pacific. ▼







### **EARN YOUR TEAM KWAJ TAB**

- 1. Attend Col. Morgan's TEAM KWAJ brief (either Teammate or Community version), read and adhere to the TEAM KWAJ Teammate Pact, presented at initial town halls, and periodically thereafter.
- 2. Attend the Island Newcomer's Briefing.
- 3. Attend at least one group greeting at air terminal for personnel arriving on island. Make them feel welcome and show them we are happy they are on Kwaj with us.
- 4. Attend at least two garrison after-hours team-building or social events (TEAM KWAJ Happy Hour, Commander's Call, Hail/Farewell).
- 5. Attend at least two TEAM KWAJ PT/Wellness sessions. Become a regular attender!
- 6. Visit Marshallese Cultural Center in last 3 months prior to tab award.
- 7. Visit Ebeye, Third island or Majuro in last 3 months prior to tab, use a Marshallese phrase or two and visit a store/restaurant.
- 8. Tell three co-workers how to earn the TEAM KWAJ tab.

- 9. Swim, snorkel, boat or paddle on the lagoon at least once with a teammate.
- 10. Complete the TEAM KWAJ Circle-island 6-mile ruck march/walk/bike and read all historic battlefield markers. This is an organized USAG-KA hosted event several times per year.
- 11. Mission Partner wild card event—discuss with your supervisor any additional organizational requirement. Could be knowledge-based, achievement-based, or physical challenge.
- 12. Final event, "Board of Review" -- meet with Col. Morgan face-to-face individually or in a small group with all requirements fulfilled. Schedule with garrison front office. Discussion items may include but are not limited to; TEAM KWAJ pact "Healthy Community of Excellence," Kwaj history, Marshallese culture, military/strategic missions and their significance, and future operational potential.

### TROLLING FOR FISH AT ROI-NAMUR

HOURGLASS REPORT

Fishing in Roi-Namur is a uniquely satisfying experience. The area isn't accessible to the general public both because of the isolation and governmental restrictions. This makes trolling in the under-fished waters feel like it's all yours to enjoy.

'Trolling' is a fishing technique that involves pulling fishing lines behind the boat as it coasts along at a low speed. The point is that it will cause the lure to mimic the movement of natural prey as it wiggles in the boat's wake.

The open sea surrounding Roi-Namur is full of the highly prized big fish—that can weigh from 15-150 lbs.—and can include Yellow fin tuna, skip jack, Mahi-Mahi, Dogtooth tuna and various others. With such mighty targets on the menu all year long, it's not a good idea to fish with regular standard fishing rods, which would quickly snap in two should such prized scores like a Marlin take the lure.

Instead, from the heavier trolling application, you'll need to use rods & reels designed to fasten to the deck. Others may prefer the han-

dline, which is a fishing line attached to a nylon rope. For this latter, one must be mindful of how the handline is pulled in, as your instinct is to twist the rope around your hand to get a better grip, but a large fish will have a much BETTER grip and will very well snatch you into the drink!

Fishing in Roi-Namur is highly recommended for our little community. To maximize your experience, please contact the Kwajalein Atoll International Sportfishing Club for tricks & tips.

### **Kwajalein Reclaimed Water Standard Violation**

The Reclaimed Water System Document of Environmental Protection (DEP) requires public notification when the standards for reclaimed water are not met. In February 2025, 87% of all reclaimed water samples were ≥ 0.5 mg/L chlorine concentration which is less than the required 95% standard. Chlorine is added as a disinfectant at the Point of Entry into the Reclaimed Water System. No health-based restrictions on the normal use (irrigation, vehicle washing, etc) of reclaimed water are necessary. There is no threat to public health or the environment resulting from this chlorine minimum. Questions? Contact V2X Environmental at 480-0722.

### **POSTMASTER UNIVERSITY | MAILING WITH YOUR MOBILE**

#### HOURGLASS REPORT

Postmaster here. Great question! Glad you asked!

Did you know that you can use your mobile device or desktop computer and Customs Forms Online to enter Customs information (no weight or dimensions), print a receipt, and take the online customs form to the Postal Associate.

If you cannot print the online customs form receipt, you can enter data on the online customs form from your smartphone, then present the customs form receipt barcode generated on your smartphones to the Postal Associate. The Postal Associate will then weigh and measure the item, select the desired service type, collect payment and print the customs form.

In addition, although USPS considers mailings to and from APO, FPO, and DPO Codes domestic mail, please be mindful that APO, FPO, and DPO Codes outside of the main customs territory of the United States (i.e., the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and the territory of Puerto Rico) are subject to international mailing standards

governing the transportation of dangerous and prohibited items through the mail.

For more details regarding quantity limitations and packaging requirements for certain mailable goods (i.e., lithium batteries, mailable liquids, etc.), please see:

- International Shipping Prohibitions & Restrictions
- USPS Publication 52, Hazardous, Restricted, and Perishable Mail, in combination with the Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, International Mail Manual (IMM).

### WEEKLY TROPICAL WEATHER THREAT OUTLOOK

RTS WEATHER STATION STAFF

#### Discussion:

We received 0.98 inches of rain for March, which is 2.58 inches below normal for the month. So far in 2025, we have only received 5.37 inches of precipitation, which is 5.91 inches below normal for the year. However, so far in April, we have received 1.07 inches of rainfall, which is 0.66 inches above normal for the month. The central RMI remains in a moderate drought, but we are have now transitioned to a wetter pattern, with an active Inter-Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) residing just to our south and bringing periods of wetter weather. The wetter conditions are expected to continue for at least a few more days, and the presence of substantial mid-level moisture means some heavy showers will be possible as well. Some upper-level troughing will provide colder temperatures and divergence aloft, which will augment the thunderstorm risk as well. One thunderstorm day occurred over the past seven days. A thunderstorm day is defined as an

"in situ" lightning strike within five miles of the weather station. The Madden/Julian Oscillation (MJO) is currently in its positive phase in early April, which is responsible for the increase of shower coverage for the central RMI. It is expected to switch back to its negative phase over the next week or so, which will likely transition the Atoll back to drier weather. The El Nino Southern Oscillation (ENSO) is still in la Nina conditions with the sea surface temperatures (SST) in the central Pacific between the RMI and the Date Line below normal. Cooler temperatures in the Pacific to the east of the RMI tend to work against increased shower activity, and are one of the main reasons for the moderate drought conditions affecting Kwajalein Atoll and the northern RMI for first part of the year, but there now seems to be changes that are starting to appear in the eastern Pacific, which are acting to erode the la Nina conditions across the whole of the tropical Pacific. ENSO-neutral is favored to develop by the end of April, and persist through the

Northern Hemisphere summer.

#### **Tropical Cyclones**:

No significant tropical cyclone activity expected to affect anywhere in Micronesia, the Mariana Islands, Wake Island or Hawai'i. We are coming out of climatological winter for the northwest Pacific, still working against tropical cyclone activity along with increased shear and the cooler sea surface temperatures (SST) between the RMI and the Date Line.

#### **Damaging West Winds** / **Westerly Swell**:

None expected. Micronesia is northeast trade wind dominant.

#### **Swell / Tide Inundation** for Kwajalein Atoll and Wake Island:

We are moving toward a half-moon on the 5th, and will experience neap tides over the next several days. Winds look to be in the mid-upper teens over the next few days before decreasing to the lowmid teens throughout most of the next week or so. Winds will be higher on the open

lagoon. Not expecting Small Craft Advisory (SCA) conditions nor High Surf Advisory (HSA) is anticipated for the next seven days. There may be gusty winds from showers into the low 20s, especially today and tomorrow.

Purpose: This weekly briefing is delivered Thursday mornings to island leadership. The intention of this briefing is to provide situational awareness of weather events that may interrupt operations and transportation around Kwajalein, to/ from Hawaii and Guam, and in the Wake vicinity. The main threat assessed in this brief is existing and potential development of tropical cyclone activity. This brief also provides an outlook of abnormal winds, sea state, and precipitation guidance for next 7 days around the Kwajalein Atoll. The distribution list will also receive updates on any developing tropical cyclone activity in the Kwajalein region that occur between the weekly outlook product.

#### WEATHER DIS-CUSSION

Somewhat drier weather can be expected as we head into the weekend following a wet end to the workweek. A few weak trade wind troughs will keep shower activity slightly elevated over the next few days, but a weekend washout is not expected. Winds are expected to maintain speeds in the middle teens before dropping into the low teens by next week. A generally dry and less breezy pattern is looking more and more likely to take hold next week as a strong mid-latitude cyclone helps to reposition the

sub-tropical high pressure system in a less favorable area for creating strong trade winds over the RMI. Our rain chances next week will remain on the lower side as the Inter-tropical Convergence Zone struggles to get organized over the region.

#### **SATURDAY**

Mostly cloudy with widely scattered showers during the morning decreasing to stray during the afternoon and a possible stray thunderstorm. Winds NE-E at 10-15 knots with higher gusts possible near any showers.

#### **SUNDAY**

Partly sunny with isolated showers and a possible stray thunder-

storm. Winds NE-E at 12-17 knots with higher gusts near showers.

#### **MONDAY**

Partly sunny with isolated showers and a possible stray thunderstorm. Winds NE-E at 12-17 knots with higher gusts near showers.

#### **NEXT WEEK**

conditions Drier look to take hold next week, with only occasional shower chances from areas of trade wind convergence. Winds will be on the lighter side, with east-northeasterly winds generally in the low-mid teens likely throughout much of the upcoming work week.
